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Fitness fanatics would appreciate Minneapolis-based Tiger Athletics' weeklong cross-training and yoga wellness package at the Las Villas Akuma, which starts at \$999 for a week, including tax, lodging, breakfast, rentals and local transportation.

If you're looking to splurge, make an appointment for a restorative Iomi Iomi massage at the Maroma Resort and Spa (\$215 for 80 minutes).

If you're looking for a unique experience, try the Temezcal treatment, an ancient steam bath treatment in a hut sweat house, followed by a plunge in the ocean, at Hotel Esencia in Tulum (90 minutes for \$95).

If reflection is part of your ideal spa vacation, a blindfolded, silent sense adventure through natural mangroves by a holistic guide at the Hacienda Tres Rios hotel might be for you. The package navigates you through trees to help you connect with your inner mind, body and spirit as cinnamon is waved in front of your nose and beans dropped over your head. The tour is included in the all-inclusive \$250 off-season rate.
