With some hotels, all that is required is that you turn up, check in and the fun begins. With others, however, the path leading to the front door can be a winding one.

From a mountain guesthouse overlooking the Bernese Alps to a private estate once owned by an Italian Duchess, here are three hotels that require you spend a little time and effort in getting there. Why? Because they're worth it!

Verana Jungle Spa, Mexico



Ensconced high on a hillside overlooking the captivating Bay of Banderas sits Verana - a boutique jungle retreat straight out of a Hollywood film set.

As a guest in this bohemian rustic resort, you'll have the delightful task of choosing from one of ten individually designed hand-made rooms: there's the Stone House with four walls and a door or the Tea House: completely open to the jungle elements where you'll fall asleep in Zenfull tranquillity under a mosquito net and a canopy of twinkling stars.

Daytime activities include yoga, watsu sessions and pampering massages in the Jungle Spa, where every treatment is preceded with a relaxing foot bath, a cup of herbal tea and the heartwarming sight of butterflies fluttering by.

How to get there: From Puerto Vallarta, you'll take a taxi to the beach at Boca de Tomatlan where Verana staff will be waiting to transport you on their panga to Yelapa. From Yelapa, it's an energetic hike up the hill while your luggage is transported by mule.

UNESCO World Heritage site. With comfortable, contemporary and functional interiors (they have to be at this height), you'll be catching your breath at the guesthouse bar whilst enjoying a sip of Chardonnay and feeling

place from which to drink in enchanting mountain views of the Aletsch-Bietschhorn - a

mighty proud that you snowshoe-hiked all the way up here, with assistance and encouragement from Freddy, the owner. After a delicious home-made dinner in the guesthouse restaurant, you'll sit by the fire and wave goodbye to the hardy skiers who don their helmets and night lights in preparation for

their descent down the mountain. But luckily for you, the only journey you will be making is

to the bubbling hot tub on the balcony, overlooking the town of Brig, thousands of metres

How to get there: At almost 2,000m above the Simplon Pass Road, in the depths of winter, you'll have the option of undertaking a snowshoe-hike up the mountain under the watchful eye of experienced mountain guide and owner, Freddy. Alternatively, it's a 20-minute drive up a winding mountain road.
