St. Lucia came through on that front for Pavelka - at least briefly. His engagement to Vienna Girardi — which took place on bended knee at Jade Mountain resort overlooking the Caribbean Sea and St.

Lucia's picturesque Piton Mountains -- was on the rocks just a few months later. But the sensual setting did spark a flurry of phone calls from brides-to-be looking for a

unique and upscale honeymoon getaway, wedding planners say. It didn't hurt that The Knot.com recently named St. Lucia among "the 50 most fabulous escapes in the world."

But even more exotic spots are gaining ground. Travel agent Isobel Mickiewicz of Toronto's New Wave Travel has seen more couples turning their sights away from the Caribbean to South Pacific destinations such as Tahiti, Fiji and Bora Bora, with dreams of spending their honeymoon nights perched above turquoise waters in huts on stilts.

Greece is also making a romantic comeback, she says, along with far-off-the-beaten-path places such as the coral beaches of the Maldive Islands in the Indian Ocean.

It seems that South America is also taking off as an affordable, yet exotic, country a quick flight away where you can scale some of the most beautiful mountains on the planet, stroll through sprawling vineyards and toast your new life together with a glass of rich, red Malbec

Soloway, for her part, has spent more than six years scouring the globe for memory-making getaway spots. Here's what she found:

- $^{\bullet}$ The Caribbean is still king among many Canadian brides and grooms, with Mexico in particular the Mayan Riviera area surrounding the delightful fishing village of Playa del Carmen — the top destination. The brightest lights at the end of the aisle are resorts such as Esencia Estate, an exclusive 29-room Mayan Rivera resort, famed for its butler service and nine-room "main house," which was once owned by a European duchess. There's also The Tides, a lush 70-room garden retreat with calming waterfalls and lagoons that has been called "the classiest resort hotel in the country."
- James Bond has helped make Jamaica big for newlyweds, as well as a recent building boom that has seen a host of new, luxury hotels spring up on its picturesque shoreline. The boutique Island Outpost chain has just done a remake of its GoldenEye Hotel & Resort, which includes the villa where Ian Fleming penned his James Bond novels. Sister property, The Caves, with its romantic private dining cave tucked into the limestone cliffs of Negril, is a perennial favourite with newlyweds.
- Beyond the Caribbean, Soloway has seen the ageless romance of Paris make a resurgence. And she doesn't know how much to credit World Cup Soccer, but demand for Honeymoon contenders reach for Caribbean's crown – thestar com South Africa, which hosted the sports extravaganza last year, is also up among newlyweds looking to combine a few wild days on safari with the charms of Cape Town, the most popular international tourist destination in all of Africa.
